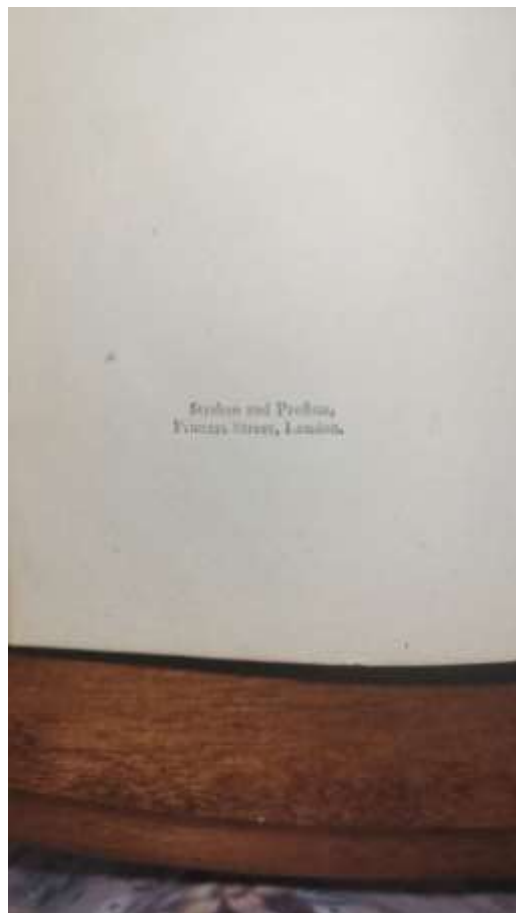
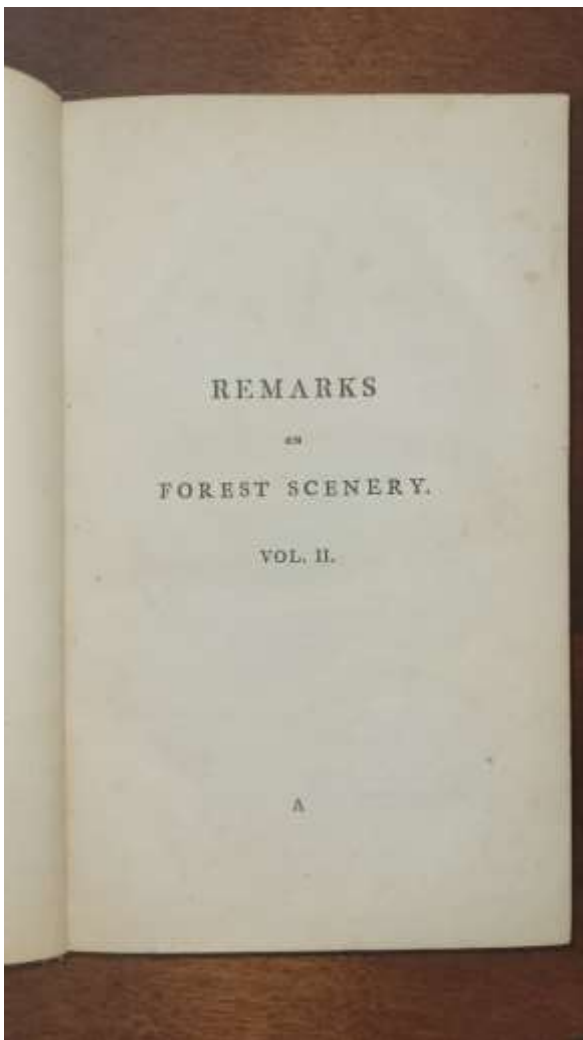

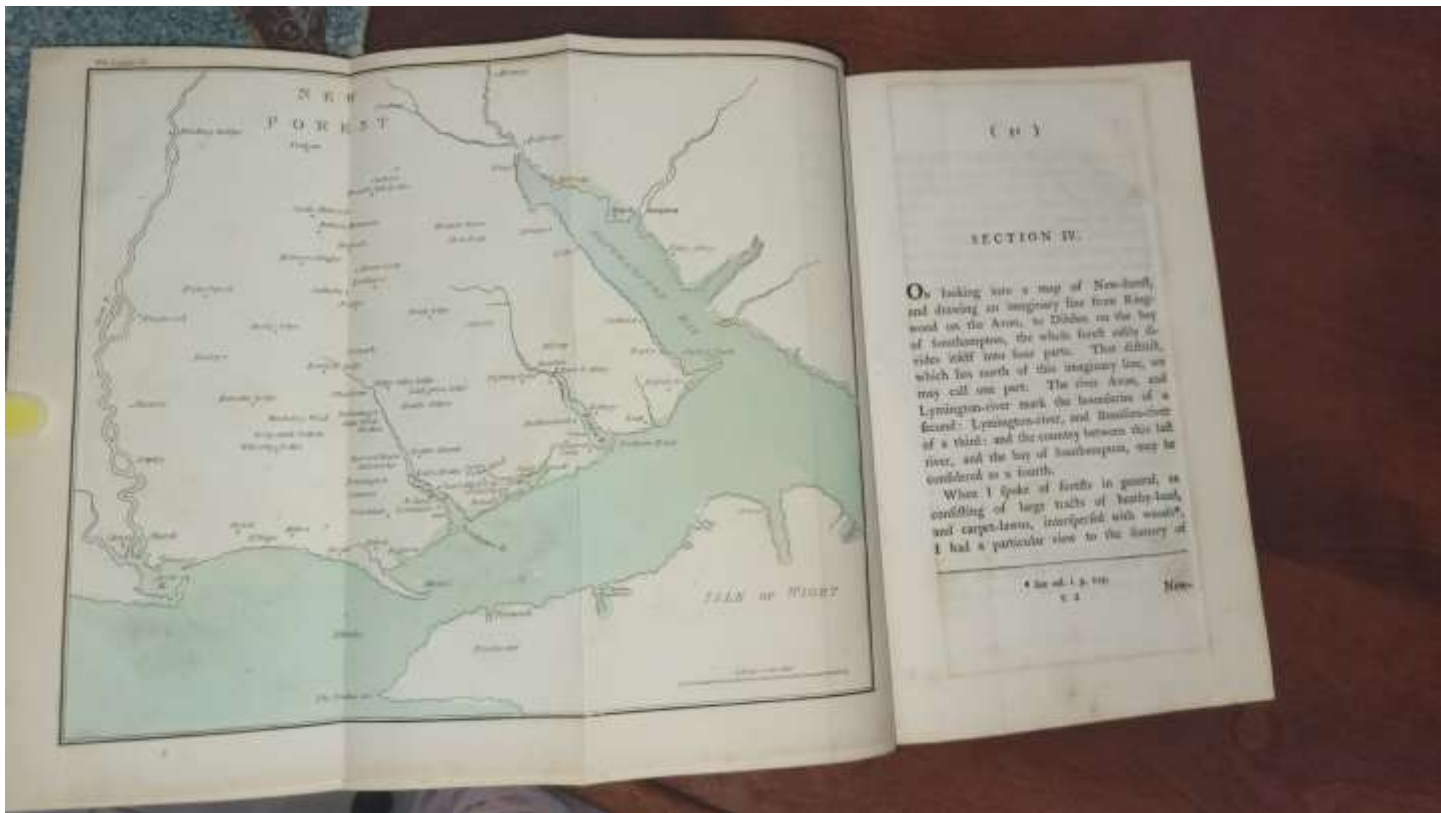

**Book Details:** This is the second volume only (of two) of a handsomely-illustrated naturalist's view of a portion of southern England. The volume contains 14 black-and-white plates (two folding) and a folding map of the region between Southampton Bay and the Avon River, bordered on the south by the Channel.

**Condition / Notes:** This antique full-leather volume has separated boards and stamped gilt lettering/ruling on the spine. There is light to moderate external wear concentrated at the edges. The book has marbled endpapers. The text block is solid. The pages, plates, and maps show light to moderate toning and scattered foxing.
