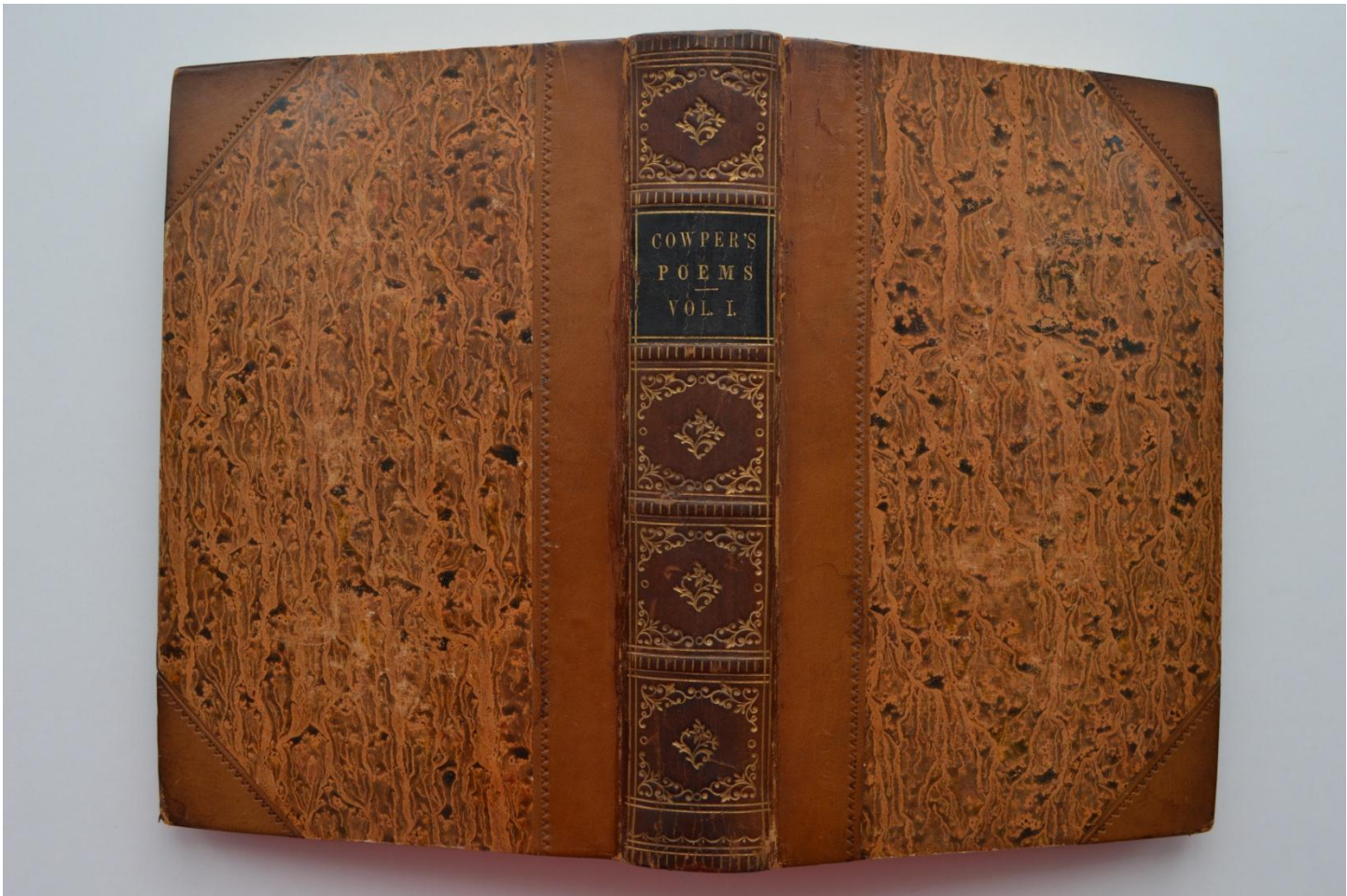

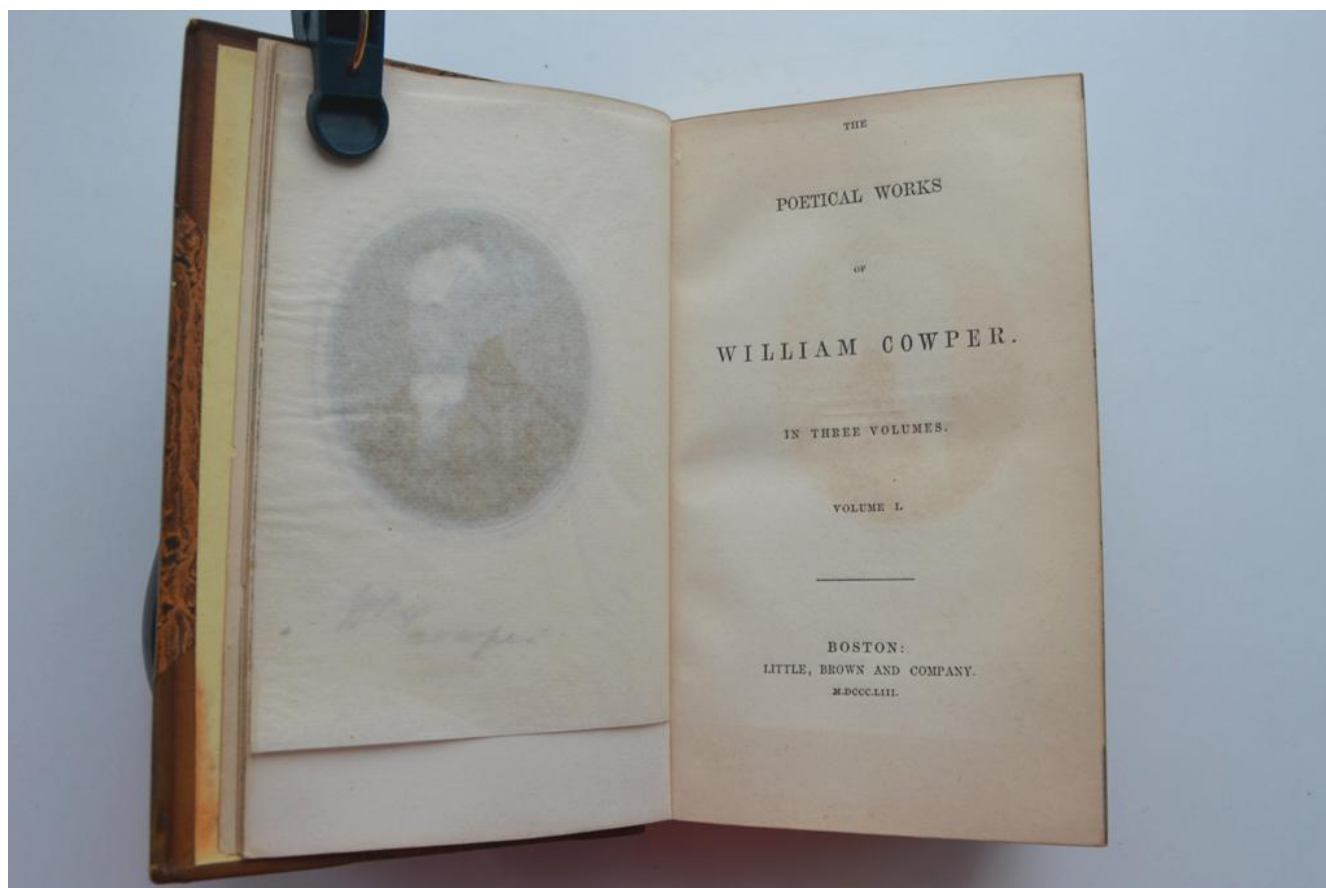
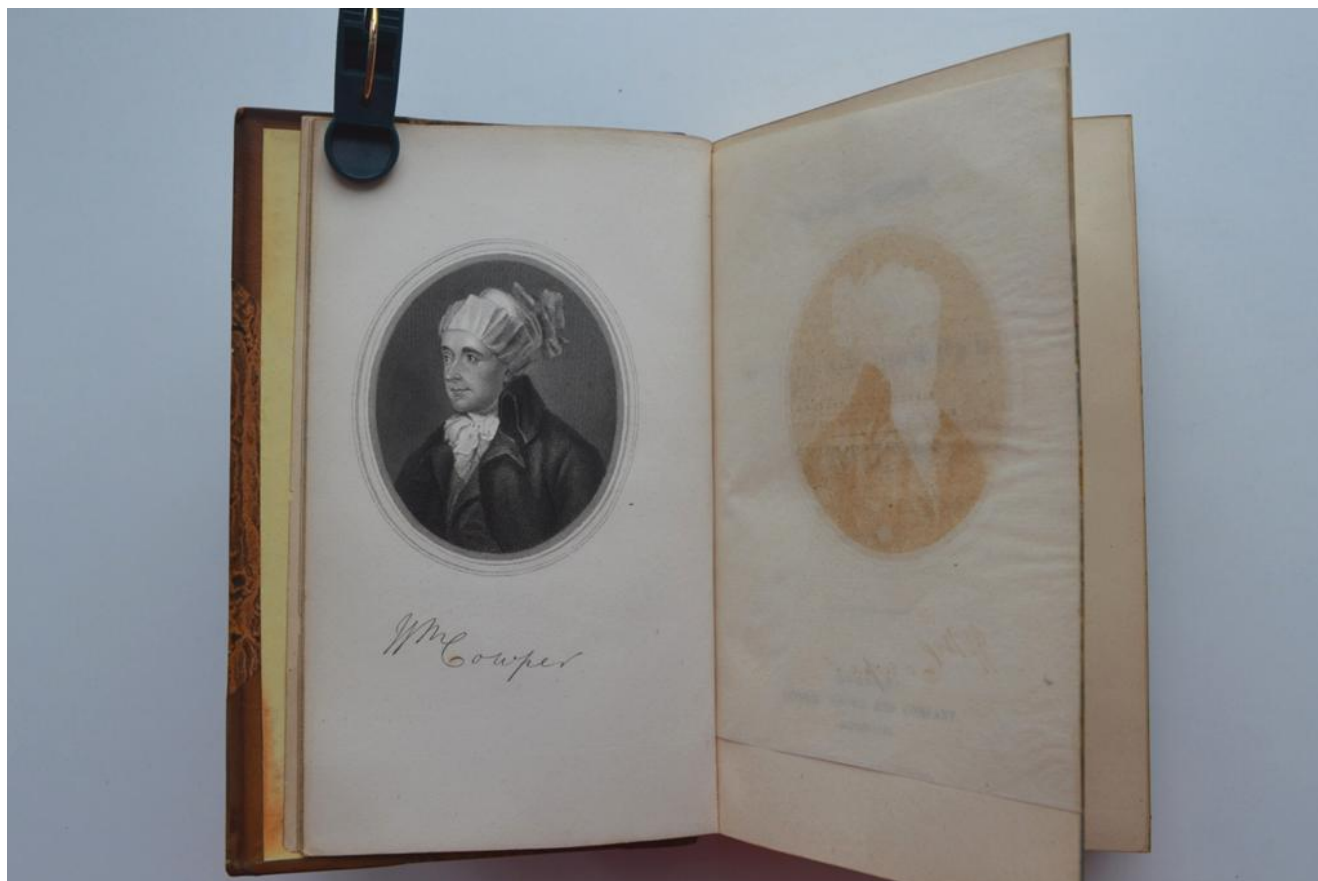

Description: Three Double Fore-Edge Books of William Cowper's Poems

"The Poetical Works of William Cowper." Vol. I, II, and III. Boston; Little, Brown and Company. Printed by H.O. Houghton and Company, sterotyped by Stone and Smart, 1853-54. Each book with its own slipcase.

Fore-edge Painting: Depicting a portrait of Cowper and his birthplace, the Vicarage Berkhamstead, Hertfordshire with the borders illustrating the poems, "The Rose," "The Dove," and "Lady Throckmorton's Bullfinch." The opposing side of Ely House, London with the same aforementioned borders.
